Working Hunter Classes: The Working Hunter classes will be judged as follows:
Phase 1: Jumping: 50 points
Style and manners whilst jumping: 10 points
Phase 2: Conformation and freedom of action: 30 points
Manners: 10 points

Penalties:	Fall of horse or rider:	20 points
	Knock down:	10 points
	First refusal or a turn around:	15 points
	Second refusal or a turn around:	20 points
	Third refusal or a turn around:	Disqualification

Competitors who incur penalties may be invited back into the ring at the discretion of the Judge, if there are less than six competitors with clear rounds.

Refreshments: A wide range of hot and cold food and drinks will be available at very reasonable prices.

First Aid: St John Ambulance will be in attendance.

CARLTON HORSE SHOW: RULES

- All competitors must wear hard hats and the correct footwear when riding on the showground.
- The Judge's decision is final.
- Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times (with the exception of Class A of the Dog Show).
- The organisers, judges and helpers disclaim all liability for damage, theft, accident, injury, illness or loss to persons, property, motor vehicles, trailers, horses or ponies, howsoever caused.
- If necessary, the number of entries in any class will be restricted, split or amalgamated at the judges or organisers discretion.
- As a charity show, under no circumstances can entry fees be refunded without a veterinary surgeon's or doctor's certificate. If the weather is doubtful, please telephone the Secretary at the number listed under Fees and General Information.
- No galloping outside the practice areas.
- A competitor's age will be deemed to be that on the day of the show.
- No whip to exceed 2'6" (75 cm) in the Working Hunter or Show Jumping classes.
- The organisers will endeavour to accommodate the movement of entries between classes running concurrently, provided they do not hinder the smooth running of the show.

RING 4: Working Hunter Schedule of Classes

Start 9.15 am

If eliminated in this class, competitors are allowed to complete the course, having up to two refusals at each of the remaining fences. Riders are not eligible for classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 & 8.
